IRCON Signalling System for N.Lankan Rly

Colombo: The Indian Railway Construction Company (IRCON) on Wednesday signed an agreement with the Sri Lankan Railways to supply signalling equipment for the railway system in the Tamil-speaking Northern Province and also to do the installation work there.

The agreement for the \$86.51 million project was signed by Mohan Tiwari, Managing Director IRCON, and B A P Ariyaratna, General Manager of Sri Lankan Railways, in the presence of the Lankan Minister of Transport, Kumara Welgama, and the Indian High Commissioner, Ashok Kantha.

The signalling system will cover the entire section in the Anuradhapura-Kankesanthurai, and Medawachchiya-Talaimannar lines, spanning 341 kms and 28 stations. Level crossings will be interlocked for safety.

Telecommunication will be based on OFC system.

India has given Sri Lanka a line of credit for \$800 million, for railway upgrading in North as well as South Sri Lanka. In February this year, IRCON had successfully completed the 42 km Matara -Galle line in the deep south.

Ircon signs deal with Lankan Rlys for signalling system

The Railway PSU Ircon has entered into an agreement with the Sri Lanka Railways for installation of signalling and telecommunication system on the rail network in that country.

The project, to be executed in the northern province of Sri Lanka at a cost of \$86.51 million, will enhance safety at level crossings and provide GPS-based station clock system, and public address system etc. at major stations, the PSU said a statement.

The work will cover the entire section in Anuradhapura — Kankasanturai and Medawachchiya — Tallai Mannar sections covering a length of 313 km and 28 stations.

An MoU was signed in this regard in Colombo between the GM of Sri Lanka Railways, Mr B.A.P. Ariyaratna, and the Managing Director of Ircon, Mr Mohan Tiwari.

Signalling work will involve provision of centralised control panel, interlocking colour light signal with electrically operated points, and train detection system, the statement said.
